

Pin the carriage on the Loco

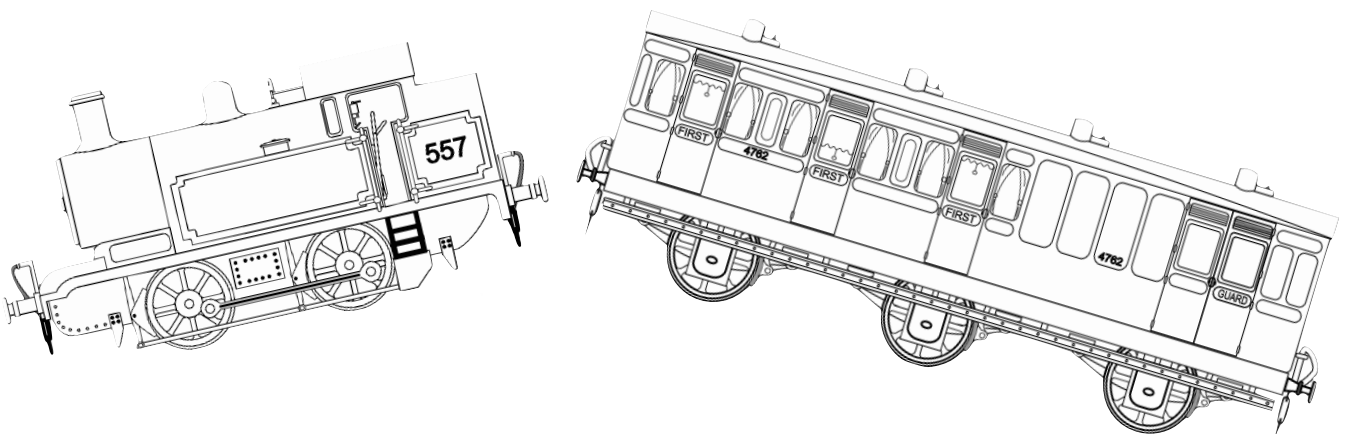
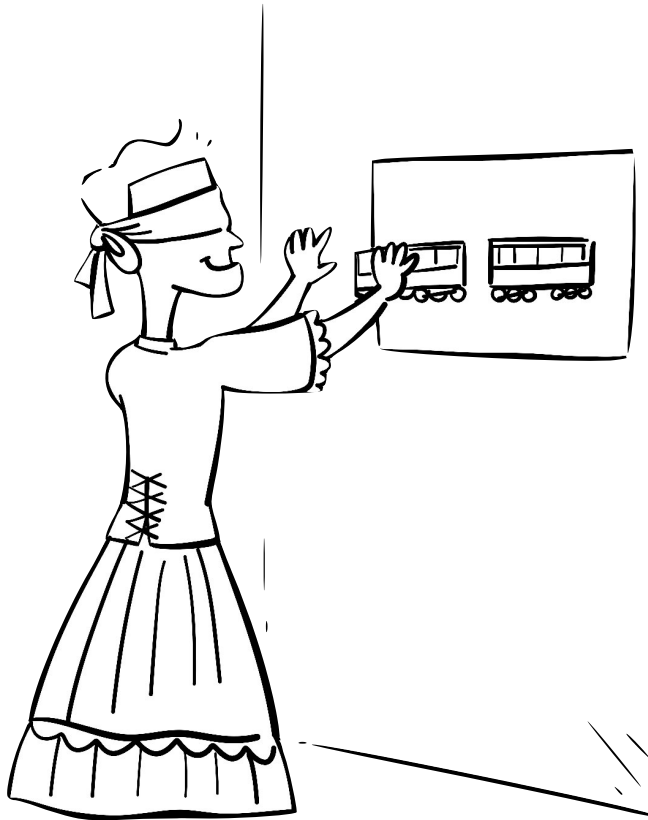
To play the game first cut out and colour in the loco and the four carriages on the following pages.

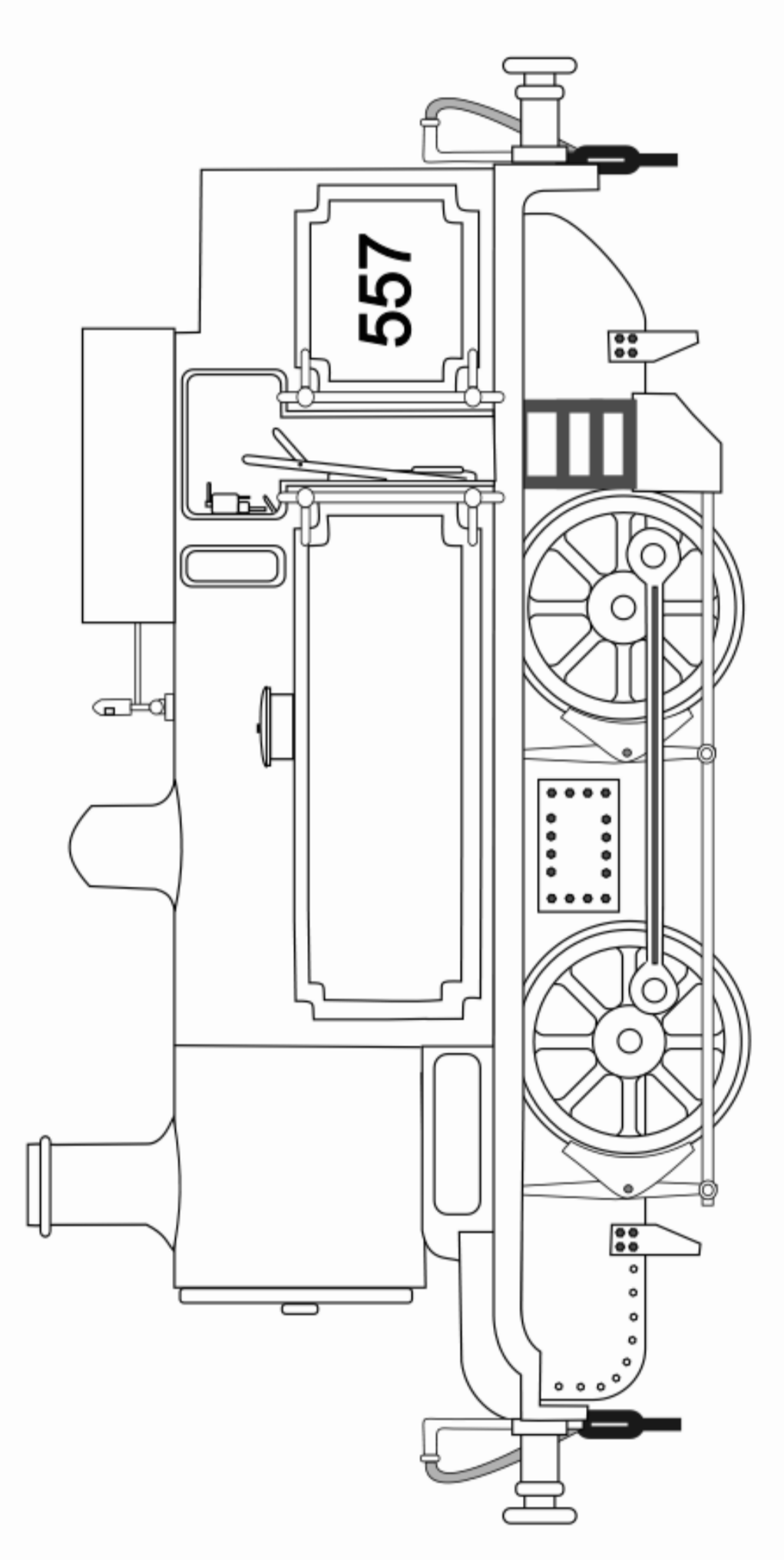
Fix the loco to the wall, you may want to use some sticky tac, as pins tend to make holes in walls and people.

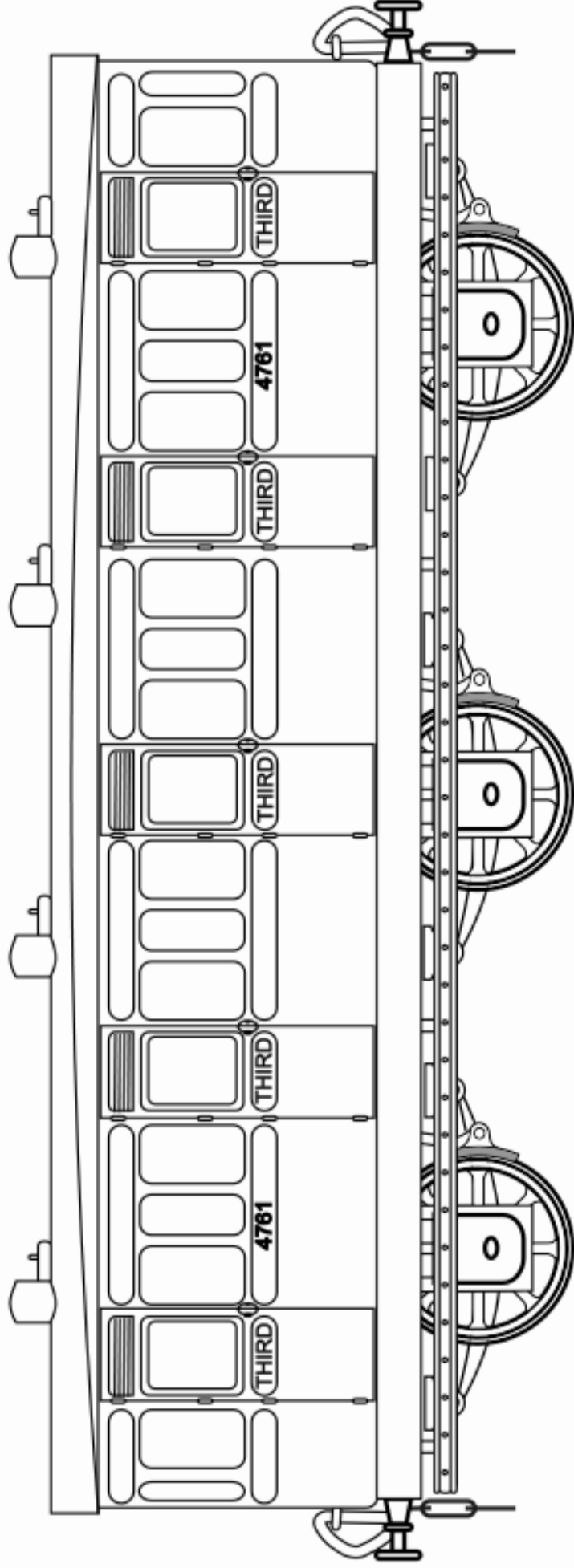
Now blindfold one of the players and give them one of the carriages, with some sticky tac and see how close they can get to connecting the two.

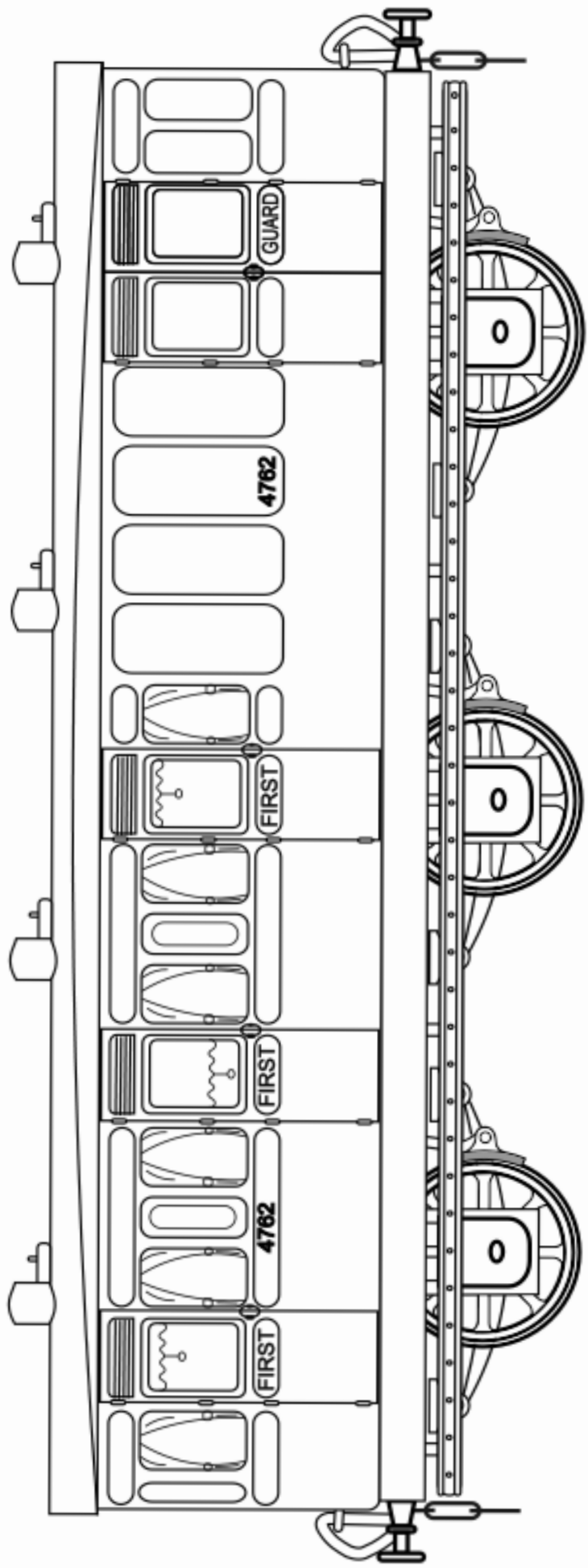
You could take it in turns to add a carriage each, or let each person in turn build a full train its totally up to you.

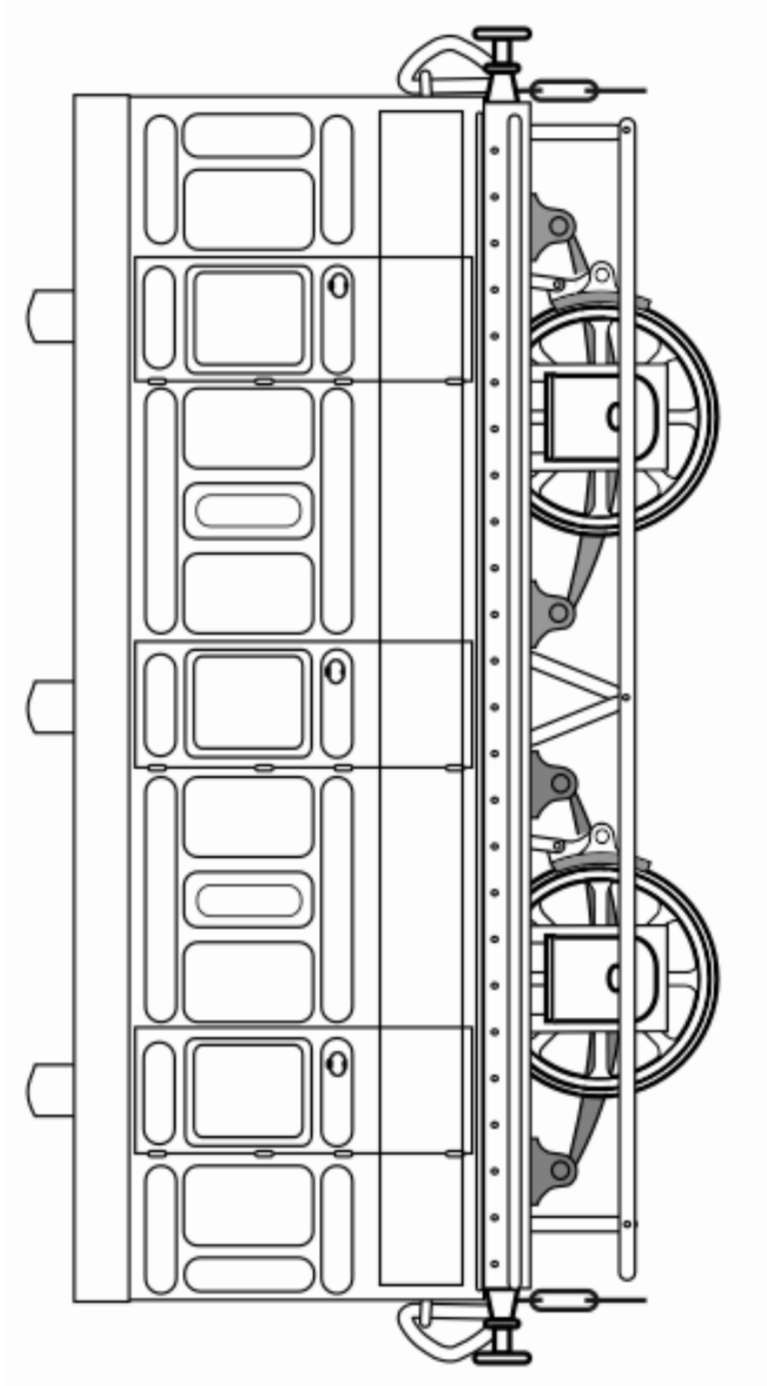

In this book I'm going to take you on a journey through the Victorian Railways to prove that the railways were a lot of things - But romantic wasn't one of them

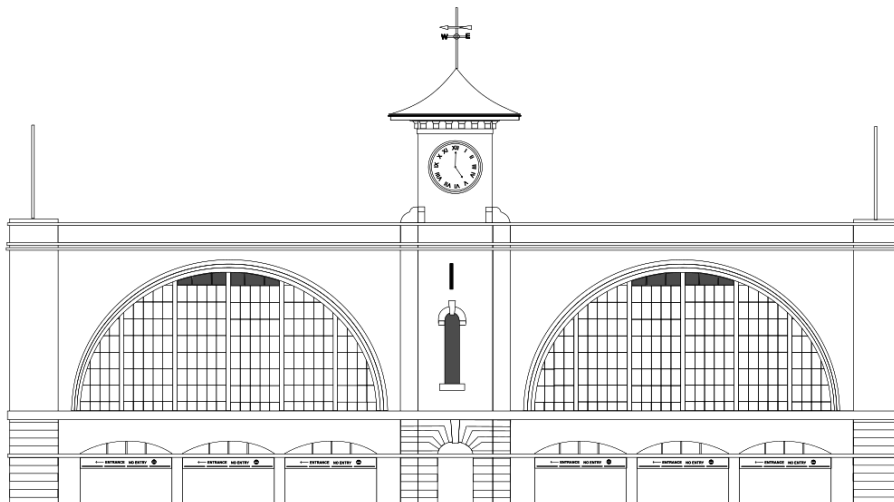
CRASHES AND ACCIDENTS
